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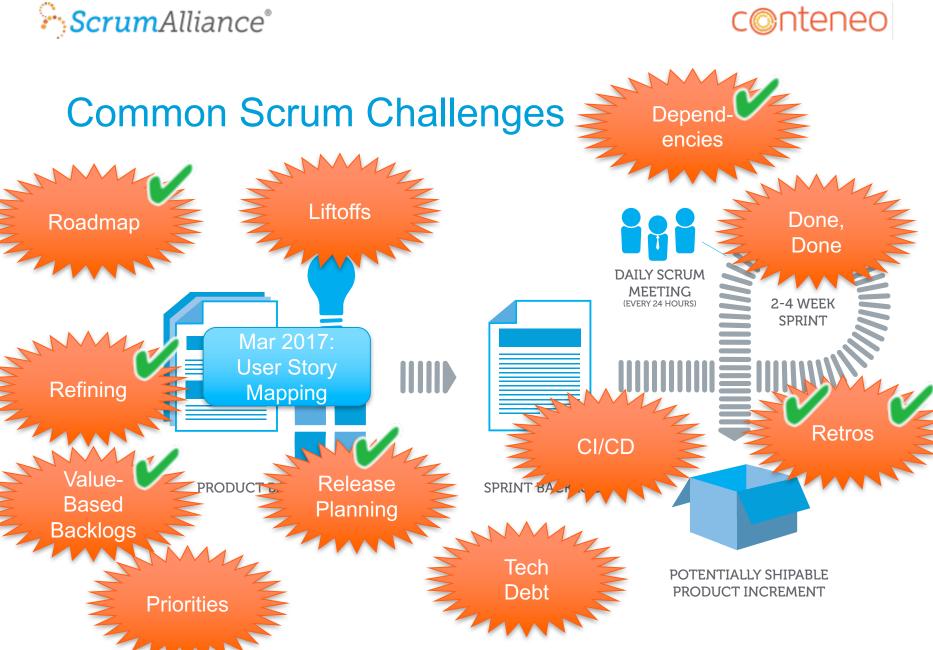

Warning Signs of Ineffective Retrospectives



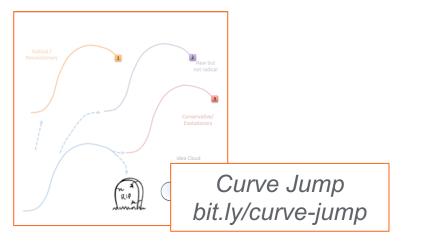




One more time... Why do we retrospect?

Because we want to understand and improve performance!





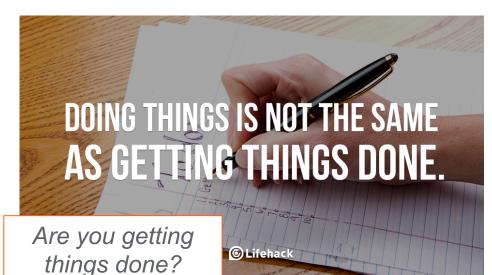

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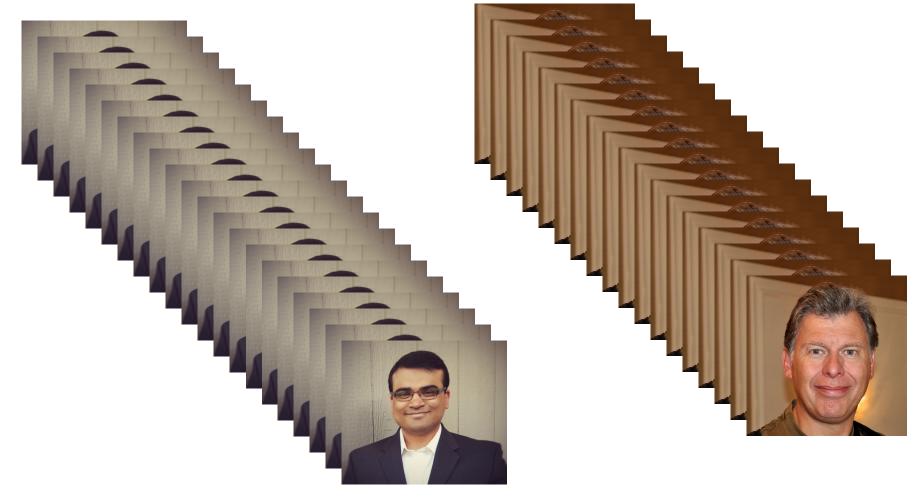








Root Cause: Overuse of Same Facilitator







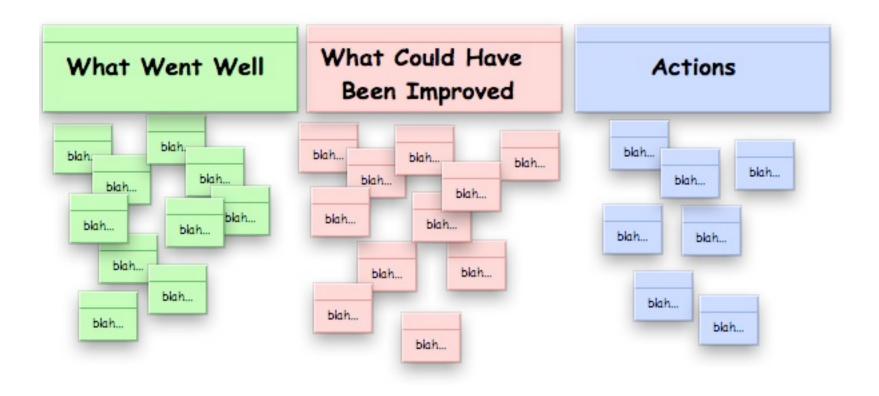
Root Cause: Overuse of Same Goal
